(e.g.) "The sound of the sea" – "sea" is a phonetic synonym for "ocean" because of the similar sound. Other examples include "the hum of the engine" where "hum" is a phonetic synonym for "noise" or "sound". The choice of sound words can create a specific mood or atmosphere, such as the soft, sibilant sounds of "the rustle of leaves" or the harsh, guttural sounds of "the roar of the engine". Sound words can also be used to create a sense of rhythm and flow in a piece of writing, as in the example "the soft, sibilant sounds of the sea".

Expected Answer: The choice of sounds impacts the text's expressiveness and reflects the narrator's emotional state and stylistic choices.
